Every year brings exciting new challenges and incredible opportunities for us, and 2022 was no exception!

Our "little summer program" has grown from serving nine kids for two weeks our first summer in 2016, to serving 31 area children this summer. This steady growth is inspiring and has enabled us to increase the scope of participants we can serve and expand our offerings. In our spring newsletter, I talked about looking to the future and figuring out "what's next" for our emerging adults with autism. Our vision statement continues to be our guide:

To equip autistic youth with the necessary resources to thrive in the world they live in today while preparing them for the world they will inherit tomorrow.

This summer was the first year for our "Express" classroom, dedicated to those participants requiring consistent 1:1 support. Due to their specific support needs, these children are all too often left out of other enrichment programs. It has been so rewarding to see

them finding success and fun at All Aboard for Kids! Also new this year was an afternoon Workplace Readiness/Adult Readiness pilot program for our older teens. This was a big step for us and a big success! We're passionate about preparing these young adults to contribute in meaningful ways, both through pre-employment opportunities and community engagement, and we're excited about the future of this new program!

My sincere thanks goes out to all the families, friends, community members, and organizations who believe in our vision and continue to provide support and encouragement to All Aboard for Kids. Our programs are making a difference and the future is bright! Thank you for partnering with us!

## **EXPRESS ROOM**

New this summer, with the support of a grant from Story County Community Foundation (SCCF), we were able to provide a classroom dedicated to serving children intensely affected by autism, with a history of severe social-emotional or behavioral needs.

These children needed individualized approaches, additional support, and

guidance in order to successfully participate in our summer programming.

A key component to the success of our project was recruiting a lead teacher and support staff with the passion to serve and the skills to meet Randick, Story County Conservation, the needs of these unique children. All of our participants completed all four weeks of programming this

summer. This is a huge success, for both the kids and their families/ caregivers!

SCCF funding also allowed our campers to interact one-on-one with CanPlay, art therapist Dr. Nicole and Ames Public Library's Bookmobile. It was wonderful to see these kids so engaged and having fun!

## WORKPLACE READINESS PROGRAM

Adolescent training programs for teens with autism or related developmental disabilities can help make employment much more likely when the child "ages out" of the educational system at 21, but this type of pre-employment summer opportunity is not readily available for autistic teens in the Ames community.

This summer, All Aboard for Kids introduced a new afternoon

Workplace Readiness/Adult Readiness program. In partnership with other experienced leaders in the autism community, as well as local businesses, we created a program centered on functional life and pre-employment skills for teens who are quickly moving toward adulthood.

Classroom work around career exploration, self-advocacy, financial management, and social skills, as

well as hands-on activities at area businesses was included.

Space to host our program was donated by First National Bank and the Ames Chamber of Commerce, and participant scholarships and programming costs were covered by grants from 100 Women Who Care Ames and C21 Signature Real Estate. We are grateful to these community partners for helping us launch this much-needed program!

## **Autism FAQs**

#### What is autism?

Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) is a complex, lifelong developmental condition that typically appears during early childhood and can impact a person's social skills, communication, relationships, and self-regulation.

The autism experience is different for everyone. It is defined by a certain set of behaviors and is often referred to as a "spectrum condition" that affects people differently and to varying degrees.

#### What causes autism?

There is currently no known single cause of autism. There has been misinformation about the cause of autism. It is not caused by vaccines or due to parenting style or nutrition.

# What is it like to live with autism spectrum disorder?

Autism impacts an individual throughout their lifespan. However, research shows that early diagnosis can lead to improved quality of life. Most individuals with autism do make progress over the course of their lifespan. This progress is enhanced with effective intervention and support.

There is no one-size-fits-all approach to address the needs and goals set for all individuals with autism.
