POSITION SUMMARY

All Aboard for Kids (AAFK) nurses are responsible for the care and supervision of all medical services. This care includes looking after ill or injured participants or staff, administering medication, communicating with parents, teachers, and AAFK Administrators, and organizing medications and first-aid kits. Providing healthcare to participants with acute or chronic health problems and keeping records of participant visits.

CERTIFICATION and/or EXPERIENCE
